Community Letter



Dear Friends.

Thank you for taking the time to read our annual report for 2024. During the year, we received state and national recognition for quality, the strength of the hospital, and even for the cleanliness of our facility. Such awards are nice, but the most important recognition is knowing our patient trust us to care for them.

Our reported community benefit increased by \$225,000 in 2024. Financially, though we had a positive margin, expenses rose faster than reimbursement, resulting in margins exceeding expenses by \$600,000 fewer dollars than in the previous year. Fortunately, investments and non-operating income were strong, resulting in an overall net gain from prior year. Nationally, hospitals and clinics are under extreme financial pressure—including a bewildering array of prior authorization and denial tactics from insurance and Medicare advantage plans-bringing us to a point where about a third of rural hospitals considered at risk for closure. I am happy to reassure you that CMC remains strong and stable.

Two big initiatives started in 2024 that may impact you in coming years.

First, responding to community need, we established a childcare center, Community Kids Center quickly reached capacity, to the point that we are looking at future growth options.

Second, we began a year-long process to convert our electronic health record system to the EPIC platform through Bryan Health, scheduled to occur in September of 2025. EPIC is used by nearly all of the large medical centers in Nebraska, Kansas, Iowa, and Missouri, and allows patients to share records with doctors regionally and nationally. Its MyChart feature has become the industry standard for patients to access and utilize their medical records. To remain relevant for patients in an increasingly interconnected world, joining the EPIC platform was critical. We think you'll like it.

Lastly, you will read about and see pictures of some of our amazing staff. I wish we could include everyone. Please consider those shown to be representative of all the wonderful people at CMC who are dedicated to serving others, caring with compassion, and making a difference.
